POLICE REPORT

Okay, so it's not the most festive news, but Police Scotland continue to provide regular updates.

Figures for the most recent month available, October 2023, are 57 calls in total from the Chryston/Muirhead area, with 8 crimes recorded. These were 5 road traffic offences, 2 cases of vandalism and one theft by housebreaking where cash was stolen.

We're pleased these figures are so low, but we would like to remind everyone, especially at this time of year, to be more vigilant with their property, ensuring everything (vehicles, houses, doors and windows) is locked and secured. And please remember to keep an eye on elderly neighbours, especially in the event of poor weather.

St Barbara's church is running a warm space once more for folks to meet and share time together. The church hall will be open to the public on Thursdays (except 28 December) between 12.30 - 3pm. Soup and sandwiches will be provided free of charge.
