The August meeting of the Community Council was well attended by members of the public, a number of whom expressed disquiet concerning the building of a Snooker Hall on the main street opposite their homes. They felt that this would become another source of noise and disturbance late at night.

The Council agreed that whilst every sympathy was accorded to the Petitioners, the over-riding factor was that permission had been granted by the District Council for the construction to go ahead and the Club to be opened. All that could be done at this stage will be to monitor the situation carefully and report the slightest infringement.

Another matter of great importance was a request that the Community Council join in a demand for Day Centre for this area. Cllr. McCulloch was asked to look into this and report back at the next meeting. It appears that as Chryston is central for Health Visitors, Midwives and District Nurses, it is essential that there should be a Centre to which their charges can be brought. As distinct from a Day Hospital which requires staffing by professional personnel, a Day Centre can be staffed unqualified attendants.

In view of the ever increasing numbers of aged and infirm people in the Community and in the surrounding area, the Council agreed that once more information is to hand, pressure should be brought to bear on the appropriate authorities.

The Chairman thanked all members of the public for their attendance and assured them that action will be taken wherever possible.


