Chair Remarks – The chair welcomed everyone to the meeting.

Minutes of previous meeting proposed by Stuart Dallas and seconded by Alec Taylor.

Business Arising – Stuart Dallas gave update on bins at bottom of Co-op car park. NLC will remove unclaimed blue bins (approx. 5). Clothing bin at top of car park overflowing and Salvation Army contacted about excess.

Secretary Report -

Secretary gave floor to Carole Henderson from NCCF who explained their intention to lobby the Scottish Government on local issues that NLC are not responding to adequately.

Secretary and Chair acknowledged the issues raised and explained that these very same issues have been raised by CCC over the years including the previous Local Development Plans and used various platforms including LAP meetings at the time.

Secretary and Chair agreed to list our own issues and submit to NCCF.

Secretary explained road works on Cumbernauld road as exploratory works by Scottish Water to identify pipework. Only 24hr notice was given for commencement.

Planning -

Secretary explained that the long delayed Local Development Plan has now been submitted with final amends to Scottish Government for approval.

Self Storage facility proposal for old FEP land was refused again by NLC. This was an amended application to address the points raised by Scottish Reporter on the appeal refusal.

AOCB –
