

# Chryston Community Council

Minutes of meeting held on 31<sup>st</sup> Oct 2022 at Chryston Parish Church

Chair Remarks – The chair welcomed everyone to the meeting.

Minutes - Adoption was proposed by Stuart Dallas and seconded by Norma Corrigan.

Business Arising – Minor amendments suggested to minutes of previous meeting.

Secretary Report – Secretary not in attendance.

Planning –

Window for objections to manse development closed shortly after the previous meeting, leaving little time for submissions.

Cllr Williams noted that there is no date given for Heathfield development consultation as yet and that the development schedule has changed so that houses closer to Muirhead are built before the road. Concerns were raised about increased traffic throughput, congestion and further denigration of air quality if the access road is not built. Brian Elder pointed out that the air quality monitoring device in Station Rd does not actually exist, although others are known to be present in the area. The possibility that the community council may purchase air quality monitors was mooted.

There was some confusion over the names of the community organisations which should be informed of the consultation – Cllr Williams will attempt to resolve this.

Reports -

Northern Corridor group attendance – Volunteers sought to attend the Northern Corridor Community Forum meetings.

Environmental – Cllr Williams and Stuart Dallas will collaborate to produce updates on Environmental group.

Community Policing – Brian Rice provided a report. Members agreed the information was useful and would like the reports to continue. Cllr Williams and Brian Rice will communicate with their police contacts to request information on traffic-calming measures and speed limit enforcement.

Roads and Lighting – Fly tipping at the bottom of Lindsaybeg Road has been cleared away and damaged kerb fixed.

Finance – Treasurer not in attendance. Profit & Loss statement (Year to date) circulated via email.

AOCB –

Discussion regarding re-locating defibrillators so they are distributed more evenly through the village.

Discussion regarding the possibility of collating a list of warm-space facilities being run in the area. This schedule could be posted on Facebook, the Community Council website or added to the noticeboard.

A poppy wreath has been procured by Brian Elder. As Mr. Elder will be unavailable on 13<sup>th</sup> Nov. Stuart Dallas will represent the Community Council at the remembrance ceremony.

The Gala committee has created a justgiving.com page to fund a Christmas tree for the village and posted it on Facebook.

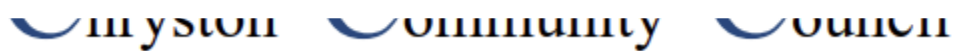
