Minutes of meeting held on 27th November 2023 at Chryston Parish Church

Chair Remarks - The chair welcomed everyone to the meeting.

Minutes of previous meeting - Adoption was proposed by R. Boyd and seconded by B. Rice.

Business Arising - Maintenance of defibrillator has been organised by B. Elder. The work has already been carried out and the bill processed.

Secretary Report - An email was received from Paul Dey, Acquisition Surveyor for Gateley Hamer, regarding the proposed upgrade of the telecommunications equipment at Avenuehead Farm, Gartcosh. There is an existing mast onsite already and it appears there will be little, if any, impact on the area. The council opted not to object to this proposal.

Planning - No planning applications requiring action.

Community Police Report - 57 calls in total to the police from the Chryston/Muirhead area.

8 crimes recorded for Chryston/Muirhead area with breakdown as follows:

- 5 x Road traffic offences
- 2 x Vandalism
- 1 x Theft by housebreaking, where a quantity of cash was stolen

Northern Corridor Volunteers - Volunteers have been clearing annuals from the planters around the village and replacing with spring bulbs.

Two large planters have been moved to Moorpark from outside the Indian restaurant, where they are no longer needed after the installation of roadside bollards.

The overgrown area at the rear of the Muirhead Inn has been cleared.

Roads and Lighting - S. Dallas reported two streetlights out on Cumbernauld Rd. These have now been fixed.

Parking outside the butcher continues to be a dangerous problem. Bollards are scheduled for installation some time in December, although it is unclear if this will solve the problem.

Finance - The accounts were returned from the auditor and signed copies sent the accountant by R. Boyd.

Beacon - B. Elder and R. Boyd are working on the next edition of the Beacon. Distribution of printed copies to local shops etc should take place before Christmas.
