Minutes of meeting held on 23<sup>rd</sup> September 2025 at Chryston Parish Church

**Chairman’s Remarks** – The Chair welcomed everyone to the meeting.

**Minutes of previous meeting** – Adoption was proposed by B. Elder and seconded by C. Little.

**Secretary Report** – No new correspondence requiring action.

**Planning** – Nothing noted.

**Northern Corridor Community Forum** – Next meeting 29<sup>th</sup> October 7:00pm at Cardowan Community Hub. S. Dallas is unable to attend and has already sent his apologies.

**Northern Corridor Community Volunteers** – No report as neither S. Dallas nor Cllr. Williams were in attendance.

**Community Police Report** – During the month of October there were a total of 79 incidents reported in the area, with 29 recorded crimes. A total of twenty-nine crimes were recorded, with the breakdown as follows:

The local community team undertook an action plan to tackle vehicle crime within the local subdivision. This resulted in a large number of vehicle stops after speed detecting and pro-active stop searches.

**Roads and Lighting** – New potholes were noted at the junction of Chryston Rd and Cumbernauld. These will be reported on [fixmystreet.com](http://fixmystreet.com).

**Beacon Fund** – Nothing pending.

**Beacon Newsletter** – B. Elder and R. Boyd will liaise to discuss the possibility of creating a winter edition of The Beacon Newsletter.

**Local Place Plan** – C. Little presented a report on the current status of the LPP. The proposed measures consultation is still available online and feedback already received has been collated for use. It is expected that the draft LPP document will be available for review within a few weeks. It was suggested that the draft may be circulated to local businesses as well as other community councils.

**AOCB** – Visitors Michael McCormick and Jon McAfee from Crowwood Golf Course spoke about the environmental problems which they believe are the result of housing developments in Greenlea Rd. There are often areas of flooding on the golf course caused by excessive runoff, which could have been reduced by the addition of a culvert or soakaway during construction. Chryston Community Council advised that they should locate the original planning applications for the housing developments and verify if any mitigating environmental measures were included.

They also reported that unsuitable materials (a chain link fence) had been used as a boundary, and that the fence was subsequently badly damaged by contractors dumping large quantities of spoil on it. This is not the first instance of a contractor dumping materials at the site of a job. The community council advised that this be reported to North Lanarkshire Council.
